

**GRAND JUNCTION LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY
MINUTES
MARCH 16, 2022**

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:01 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam D. Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Selestina Sandoval.

II. License Renewal Applications

Administrator Barbara Case, Bar Manager Jon Gartz and Event Planner Melissa McConnell were present and answered a series of questions regarding the event location, security and how it will be conducted lawfully. Mr. Gartz asked to substitute the diagram submitted with one that included the social quarters bar in the licensed premises. The diagram was accepted. Hearing Officer Starritt verified with Ms. Sandoval the application was in order and asked if there was anyone present to speak against the application. There was no one. He entered Exhibits "A" and "C" (attached) into the record.

Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to Colorado State Statute 44-5-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit; it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws. The application for a special event permit submitted by Loyal Order of Moose Grand Junction Lodge 270 for "Retirement Party – 2022" was in order and approved.

SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT
QUESTIONNAIRE AND AFFIDAVIT

1. Name of Event: Tulips & Julips Derby, CIC Meeting, Garden Groove Concert Series and Harvest Illuminated Halloween Event
2. How many attendees are expected? 300
3. Has the event been held in the past? If so, how many years? 7
4. Have there ever been any violations or citations issued during the event in the past?
Proud to state we have not had a violation in the 7 years we've produced these events
5. Describe the premises at which the event will take place (attach diagram).
These events take place on the front lawn of the Western Colorado Botanical Gardens, just south of Struthers Ave and at the end of 7th street.
6. What type of and how many security will be provided?
We used 2 paid security personnel from CSI security. We also have two to three volunteer security personnel which are identified by wearing a yellow vest with the words security staff in bold black letters on the back.
7. Describe the Security Control Plan (use additional sheet if necessary).
We position one paid security person at the gate (the only entrance and exit to the events) from start to finish. The additional paid security person is positioned in the area where the alcohol is served and tickets are purchased. The three volunteer security personnel are positioned at the following locations: 1.) ID check and banding area 2.) Behind the stage area and 3.) front stage area. All possible issues observed will be brought to my attention and dealt with accordingly with the paid security staff and myself.
8. How will security personnel be identified?
The paid security staff will be dressed in their CSI uniforms and the volunteer staff will wear a yellow vest with the words security in bold black letters security staff on the back.
9. If this event is an outdoor event, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
There is a permanent six foot high steel fence surrounding the entire area of the botanical gardens. There is only one entrance and exit that will be opened during the event, which is located at the east end of the botanical gardens area.

10. What method of age verification will be used (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)?

ID checks will be made by the TIPS trained volunteer staff as the patrons enter through a second gated area onto the front lawn. Wrist bands will identify who is 21 years of age or older. The band will be applied after the ID check is verified. Ticket sales and servers will verify again for wrist bands as double check.

11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom?

All servers will monitor and report to me, I and the paid security staff will monitor and address issues.

12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages?

Yes we have TIPS trained volunteers. We also use the TIPS training information at each event for a brief training for those people who are volunteering for the first time to educate them before working.

13. What other types of beverages and food/snacks will be available?

Water, soda and food truck certified by both the city and county.

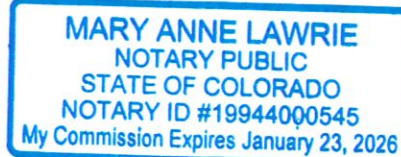

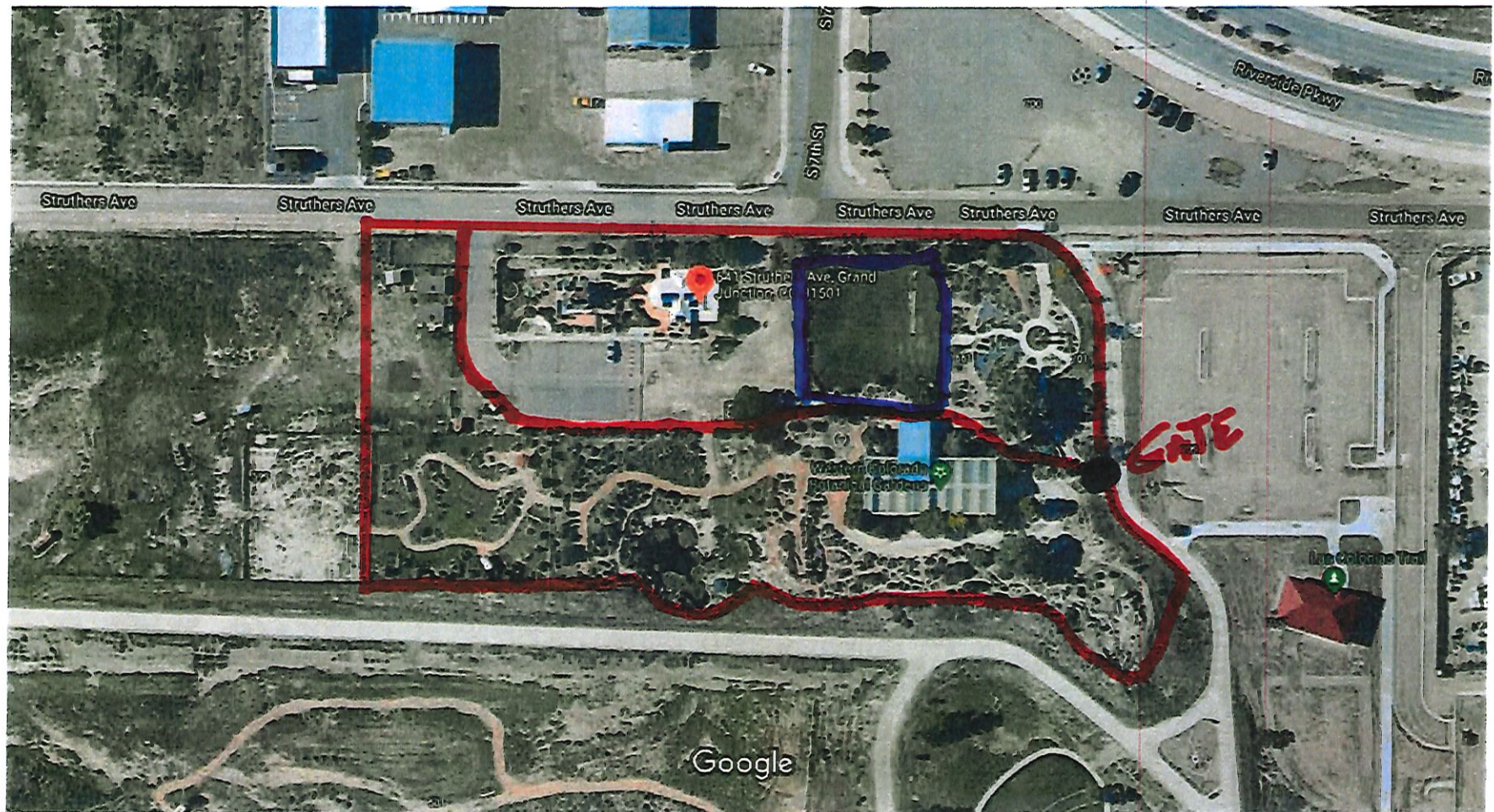
